

Over 100 guests were on site for the SAGE Outdoor Education Centre grand opening during Campmeeting 2018. This magnificent structure will serve the students of the Alberta Conference for their outdoor education program. Located among trees, it is an excellent spot to observe and study God's book of nature. It is also available for churches and other groups to use for their functions. It is equipped with tables and chairs to accommodate up to 100 people. There is still work to be done before the 32'x48' facility is fully completed. Rest room facilities will be erected this spring along with painting, and the installation of flooring to finish the building. Solar power has been installed and a generator will be purchased to meet needs that require more power. It is the prayer of the SAGE officers that this building will honor our Creator and enhance the lives of all those who enter its doors. —Vic Fitch
